Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre (I4C) is an initiative of MHA to deal with cybercrime in the country in a coordinated and comprehensive manner

I4C focuses on tackling issues related to cybercrime for citizens, including improving coordination between various Law Enforcement Agencies and stakeholders

A citizen-centric National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) was launched in 2019, as one of the most significant achievements of I4C

Another initiative of I4C, National Cybercrime Helpline number 1930, is helping the common citizen in registering online financial frauds

Over 29 lakh complaints have been reported on National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) till date with a daily average of more than 5000 complaints

Both, Helpline 1930 and NCRP, have saved over 765 crore rupees of defrauded money from reaching the hands of fraudsters till 30th September, 2023

I4C, in collaboration with Archaeological Survey of India, is displaying the Cybercrime Helpline Number "1930" and

NCRP (cybercrime.gov.in) at Qutub Minar to raise awareness about the prevention of cybercrime
