**Assam April 07, 2026:** Honorable Union Home and Cooperation Minister Shri Amit Shah today addressed massive public rallies in Sribhumi, Hailakandi, and Cachar in Assam and appealed to the people of the state to form a BJP-NDA government with an overwhelming majority.

Shri Amit Shah said that today is the last day of campaigning, and everyone has gathered to ensure the victory of BJP candidate. Votes for him are not just to make him an MLA, but to free the entire Barak Valley from infiltrators. He said infiltrators have been identified, and the time has come to remove them one by one from the country. The people of Assam must decide between the BJP, which renamed Karimganj as "Sribhumi," and the Congress, which seeks power with the support of infiltrators. He alleged that the Congress has turned the region into an infiltrator-dominated area and wants to do the same with all of Assam. He added that no matter how many generations of Rahul Gandhi come, Assam will be freed from infiltrators.

The Union Home Minister said that the region has supported the BJP for a long time. He urged people to give all four seats of Sribhumi to the BJP and send a message that

the land is called "Sribhumi." He said those whose roots lie in Italy cannot understand its importance. He mentioned that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given classical language status to Bengali and Assamese. He accused the Congress of deliberately turning the region into an infiltrator-heavy area.

Shri Shah said that due to vote-bank politics, the Immigrants Act of 1950 was scrapped. He said that the Act was brought to protect Assam, but the Congress passed the IMDT Act in 1983, which gave shelter to infiltrators. Wetlands, grazing lands, forests, and the Barak Valley gradually became filled with infiltrators. He listed districts like Dhubri, Barpeta, Darrang, Morigaon, Hojai, Nagaon, and Goalpara as becoming infiltrator-dominated. He said that under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government, infiltration will not only be stopped but infiltrators will be removed from the country. He alleged that infiltrators are taking away jobs from local youth, sharing food meant for the poor, and affecting tea garden workers' wages, and said this will not be tolerated.

He said that Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has freed 1.5 lakh bighas of land from infiltrators and that this campaign will continue. He emphasized the commitment to protect "jati, mati, bheti" which means cultural identity, rights over land and cultural foundation. He said Prime Minister Modi honored Dr. Bhupen Hazarika with the Bharat Ratna, while Congress leaders objected. He criticized remarks that reduced Hazarika's contributions to singing, calling him a true ambassador of Indian culture.

Shri Shah said the BJP installed Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's statue in Silchar and renamed Karimganj as Sribhumi, which the Congress opposed. He questioned leaders like Gaurav Gogoi for opposing it and said only names connected to Indian culture will remain. He credited Prime Minister Modi for giving global recognition to Assam's culture, including popularizing the "gamosa." He alleged that Rahul Gandhi refused to wear the gamosa when asked. He said Congress governments built over 700 madrasas but not a single medical college, while the Modi government established medical colleges and converted madrasas into primary schools for modern education. He also

mentioned the abolition of triple talaq and said the BJP will bring a Uniform Civil Code in the first cabinet meeting of the next BJP government in Assam

He said that since Rahul Gandhi became a leader of the Congress, the party's public discourse has hit new lows. He criticized recent remarks by the Congress president calling BJP-supporting states illiterate and said such statements insult Gujarat, which has produced leaders like Dayanand Saraswati, Mahatma Gandhi, Sardar Patel, Vikram Sarabhai, and others. He also criticized statements comparing the BJP and RSS to snakes, calling it undemocratic language. He accused the Congress of disrupting Parliament and acting against India's interests internationally. He said under Rahul Gandhi's leadership, the Congress has become a threat to democratic institutions and that the people of Assam will respond through voting.

He accused the Congress of being anti-Assam historically and recalled the 1962 war, saying India will not cede any land under Prime Minister Modi's leadership. He said violence in the 1990s led to bomb blasts, shootings, and unrest, but after Modi's government, peace agreements brought youth back to the mainstream.

He said that now there are no bomb blasts or firing, and infiltrators cannot trouble locals. The Modi government has brought peace and aims to make Assam a developed state with major investments, bridges like Bogibeel, and thousands of kilometers of highways. He highlighted the contribution of tea garden workers and said their wages will be increased to ₹500 in the next five years.

He announced that to reduce the need for Barak Valley residents to travel to Guwahati, a secretariat will be set up there. A new AIIMS center will be established in Sribhumi, a Vande Bharat train will run between Guwahati and Agartala via Silchar, and a greenfield airport will be developed. Land pattas will be given to tea garden workers, ₹3,000 per month will be provided to women. He reiterated the goal of making Sribhumi and Barak Valley free from infiltrators and appealed to people to vote for the BJP and ensure a decisive victory for its candidates, forming the government again in Assam.
